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Music Notes from Miss Allison

Lower El Group B (some 2nds and all 3rd years) learned the Turkish balance game that I described in last week's Friday Folder. We also spent time doing meter and rhythm work with plastic cups: Place different sizes and numbers of cups on three (triple meter) or four pieces (duple meter) of paper representing the number of beats in a measure. Large cups = quarter notes, small cups = eighth or sixteenth notes, transparent cups = rests. Stacking more cups upon the first indicates dynamics or metrical stresses. Clap the rhythms created. Students took turns in small groups to be the composer and conductor of their repeating duple or triple meter rhythm. Ask your child(ren) to show you this activity at home!

This week and last, I introduced Upper EI students to the pattern of whole and half steps required to make a major scale. I used the Montessori resonator bars and support materials to keep the lesson hands-on and concrete. Each student needs more time with the bells, but I believe that most of them can now construct a major scale starting on any pitch, including sharps and flats (black notes on a keyboard), and be able to name each note accurately.

In 6th grade class, we were able to add accompaniment (keyboard/synthesizer, xylophones, maracas, drums, bells, tambourines, recorders and a variety of un-pitched percussion) to the Peace in the Heart song in several languages. We are using our listening skills to analyze the recorded music and determine the instruments and the pitches and rhythms. We were able to play the first part without the recording. It was an exhilarating moment for us all!
