### **Notes from Michelle**

Happy New Year! I hope that all of you had a very enjoyable break and will have a healthy and happy 2018. This weekend we observe the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This is a great time to start or continue a conversation with your child about social justice and topics that relate to working together to improve the world in which we all live.

As we all make resolutions or fresh starts for the new year, perhaps we can try to take on "kindness" as a goal. Trust me, I am the first to admit that there are days when tensions are high and nerves are raw. I may have been known, on occasion, to speak sharply or answer a question in a tone that while not intended to convey disrespect, may have been as polite as possible either. This can happen to any of us, anywhere, but perhaps we can all try to be more mindful of our interactions with others.

Lately, the office has had reports of some less than polite exchanges from parents to parents and students during drop off and dismissal. In fact, some of our 4<sup>th</sup> grade students are hesitant to work at dismissal due to some people using a sharp voice when asking if their child has been called yet. Then there have been times when parents feel cars are going around and causing an unsafe environment for everyone concerned in the parking lot. Please help for the students to see adults modeling the type of kind, patient and cooperative behaviors we hope our children develop and incorporate into their own personalities. With that in mind, please keep the following parking lot guidelines in mind:

- Patience is the rule of the day- always please be patient with each other, the students running carpool, and with the speed at which the process occurs. IF you need your child quickly, it is probably best to walk in and get them. (Parking is limited but available if you arrive early.)

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### Notes from the Garden

Finally, some wet weather! As inconvenient as rain may feel, I think of it as banking treasure for a great spring and summer in the garden. We are fortunate to have some beautiful winter crops (favas, celery, cabbage, kale, and a variety of Asian greens) in our beds that will flourish with rain, and our sheet mulching project needs rain to aid in the breakdown of materials.

In our winter cycle we will be studying nature in relationship to time – how did early humans tell time, how does nature influence our experience of time, and how do we use our skills of observation to orient ourselves in our surroundings? While in the Fall we focused on our personal ecology, we will now start to study how we are interconnected and how we interact with our environment. Lower El students and I will be focusing, too, on ecology practices, while Upper El students and I will be focusing on designing our Indigenous People's Study garden and researching how social equity, preserving traditions, and growing our own food and medicine is a practice in both ecology and justice through the process of garden design and implementation.

### Notes from the Music Room

### Happy New Year!

First things first, you may have noticed that 4th and 5th graders have started studying the recorder! Each student has their own recorder, which they are responsible for bringing to class each week (4th grade- soprano recorders, 5th grade- alto recorders, optional to bring sopranos as

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well. In 6th grade, both are optional for now). We've been exploring bird songs using only the headjoint (the redwood grove behind 202 was briefly inhabited by some very exotic birds!), and So-Mi "cuckoo" sounds as our starting place for fingered notes. Please help your student keep track of their recorders- it should "live" in their backpack, or in the basket in room 202, so that it's always ready for class on Wednesday.

Aside from recorder, we've had a very full semester of songs, games and instruments. Some highlights: in upper el, we learned a 3-part song from the Georgia Sea Island singers (Yonder Come Day), listened to Grieg's 'In the Hall of the Mountain King' and learned the story of Peer Gynt's escape from the trolls, learned a traditional Basque dance with instrumental accompaniment, a circle game and song from Slovenia (Son Macaron), sung rounds, danced to music from around the world, and explored rhythmic notation through walking, stretching, running and wiggle-jiggling in the space.

In lower el, (who I see every two weeks), we explored high/low fast/slow in our Hello song, introduced small percussion with a pumpkin passing game and Witches and Ghosts, practiced solfege hand symbols (a kinesthetic form of pitch notation) and solo-singing our own names in Who's That, accompanied ourselves with xylophones, and sang lots of songs: All of the Critters, Dry Bones, Thank you for this Food, Peace Like a River, Frosty the Snowman, and of course, every grade 1st through 6th learned the Jingle Bell dance— my secret ambition is to get the whole school dancing this together in one place some day!
