- 1. Parents and administration convened January 12, 2017 for an initial meeting to explore ways of supporting a pluralistic and peaceful community on campus.
- 2. Our purpose remains open-ended and evolving. We aim to foster respectful and inclusive community experiences that reach beyond mere tolerance to true pride and celebration of our cultural, ethnic, social diversity as families committed to the common cause of nurturing peace makers.
- 3. We are committed to supporting critical thinking skills in our community that equip students to consider ideas and respond thoughtfully. We encourage peaceful communication as the means of engaging in social dialogue. We acknowledge it is modeled in Eagle Peak classrooms and public spaces. Can you believe it's already January? If you haven't met me yet, I am your new music teacher here at Eagle Peak. I am an accordionist and Orff educator with many years of experience working with children in various capacities. I also play and teach classical piano, and love dancing of all kinds. Thanks everyone for welcoming me onto team, I am thrilled to be here!

In Lower EI, we've been singing, dancing, playing games, and beginning to play simple melodies and drone accompaniments on the xylophones. In Upper EI, we are taking things a step further with the addition of soprano (4th) and alto (5th) recorders. (Please help your kids remember to bring these to class every Wednesday!). With recorders we develop fine motor skills, begin working more with written notation, naming pitches in both solfeg and as their letter names, and reading rhythms. We also sing songs, play games, and learn lots of folk dances, a great way to build community and work together while moving our bodies to a variety of music from around the world. Coming soon, we'll be adding occasional media to the Eagle Peak website so you can see some examples of what we're up to, so stay tuned!
