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<u>Notes from the Garden</u>

Last week brought a lot of reflection and gratitude for the students and me. On Wednesday, we were able to use our Nature Journals as a place to reflect on our feelings about the Sonoma and Napa fires, incorporating poetry, performance art and watercolor painting. The air quality forced us to be creative with how we used our time together and I am always moved by the depth of sensitivity our students show for the hard things in our world. I teach by a developmental gold standard in Environmental Education, which is "No catastrophes before 4th grade" (David Sobel). We can honor and appreciate our world without scaring our youngest students, and still being very constructive and careful with the growing minds of our older students. I approach environmental stewardship by sparking wonder. We will protect what we love, touch and feel akin to.

This week we studied components of healthy soil, sampled spinach grown by some of our Lower Elementary students, continue to prepare an area for our Indigenous Peoples Study Garden, and have started getting our cool season crops into the ground. Fava beans are poking up in a few beds, we've built some experimental sweet potato and potato towers, sowed wildflowers for early spring blooms, and we continue to work on cleaning up our bin compost system.

This Saturday is a garden workday for parent volunteers, 8:30-12. I will arrive as early as 7:30 if you are curious about plans moving forward with the garden and the role you may play in that. If you are coming for work, please be dressed for heavy, dirty work, and bring tools - leaf rakes, spades, a chainsaw, pruning tools are all needed.
