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Notes from the Garden

We observed the Autumnal Equinox recently and we are starting to see Fall show up in the garden. Our buckeye tree, which sets its flowers first in spring, also drops its leaves before other trees even turn color. We will be talking about the Fall cycle, learning about our soil and its care, and planning our cool season garden this next month. Our mindful practices have focused on noting signs of seasonal change. The concentration and silence of even our youngest students are powerful. I invite you to take a detour through the garden at drop off or pick up and see for yourself the beauty of our natural space.

Worms have arrived for our vermicomposting projects and we are busy studying these useful and fascinating invertebrates. Studying worms directly relates to our study of soil and 'closed-loop' ecology practice. Many of the students have been on worm duty these last two weeks preparing cozy quarters for our Red Wigglers. Please feel free to send bundled newspaper to school this week for our worm bins.

We are also working to renew our bin composting system. The AP students are working with me and Ms. Kimberlee to update our Waste Wizard program as a way of serving the school and further "greening" our school-wide waste stream management. Please consider helping your children to pack zero-waste lunches every day of the week.
