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### **Board Update**

The Board met on Tuesday, September 20, and had a great meeting. We started off with a report from the students of the Adolescent Program, which is always my favorite part of the evening! The students told us about what they had been working on so far in class, how Friday Market was going, and about their favorite parts of the year so far. Many of the items we discussed that evening dealt with the logistics for the Montessori Model UN conference in New York, which the AP students will be attending in the spring and for which they will be preparing throughout the year.

When it was time to talk about the budget, we realized that we wanted to communicate something important to the parents. Many of you already know, but some of you may not, that state funding for public schools is directly tied to attendance. We receive approximately \$17,000 more as a school if we raise our attendance by a percentage point. There are, of course, many important reasons for your kids to be in school, but add this one to the list! And please be sure, if your child is out for two or more days, please ask your teachers for an Independent Study packet. The teachers will prepare a packet of work to be completed at home that will complement what the class was doing during your child's absence. You will need to sign a copy of the plan in the office. For your child, it means that they will be able to make up some of the work that they are missing. For the school, it means that your child's absence will not count against our overall attendance record.

If you have any questions about any of the above issues or about what is going on with the school, please come on by and visit a Board Meeting! They are the third Tuesday of every month at 6:30 and are open to the public. There is a period at the beginning of the meeting reserved for people to tell the Board what is on their

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### Music Notes from Ms. Diana

Dear 4th and 5th year parents,

Hello! You may have noticed already, the 4th and 5th grades have started studying recorder in music class! The kids are very excited about their new instruments and eager to practice. These recorders belong to the students, thanks to your contributions enabling the school to purchase recorders for every student each year. This is such a wonderful gift that the students can keep for the rest of their lives.

Here are a few things for parents and students to remember about the recorders:

- Students are responsible for bringing their recorders to music class every Wednesday. (5th years are encouraged to bring their sopranos as well). I recommend that the recorder stay in the students backpack, so that it always comes with them to school. They may also leave them on a designated shelf at school.
- Do not eat or drink (other than water) right before playing. This will help keep the recorder clean.
- Please be safe. Practice while sitting, standing, or walking slowly, never while running, and not in a car which may stop suddenly.
- Be considerate. It is wonderful to practice, but be kind to the people around you and ask them if it's a good time first.

Happy practicing! It has been a pleasure working with the students so far this year, and I look forward to getting to know the Eagle Peak community better throughout the upcoming year. Thank you!
