Dr. Maria Montessori did not simply envision an educational methodology. She created a movement. A movement that believes education can change the world. She lived in Italy during one of the darker moments of history and stood up for what she believed even when it cost her the ability to stay in her native country. She saw education as a way to change the world. I am grateful for her vision and for the charge that those of us in the Montessori community (Montessori educators, Montessori students and Montessori parents) have to do our best to create understanding and peace through

caring for others. Dr. Montessori believed we were global citizens and had a cosmic task to take care of our motherland (the earth and its people). Thank you all for supporting and helping this educational model be so vibrant, even over 100 years since its conception.

I have included a letter from State Superintendent Tom Torlakson, regarding protecting our students throughout the state. He also lists resources at the end of his letter.

We had a special quest speaker in the classrooms today. Adria Benehashemi is a cross cultural educator and parent at the school. She came to discuss the history of Thanksgiving. Please see this note from her, "Today in addition to celebrating a Thanksgiving feast at Eagle Peak, each classroom participated in a discussion of the holiday's history. We talked about how this holiday can be a powerful unifying experience (the main reason Abraham Lincoln had for starting the national Thanksgiving holiday in 1863). Eating a meal together is such an important human experience. And practicing gratitude or thankfulness has been proven scientifically to be very healthy for our brains and emotions! In addition to the very positive aspects of this holiday, we also discussed why some people feel sad about it...namely American Indians whose ancestors lost so much land and life as a result of European immigration to this continent and the subsequent policies and practices of the US government. The goal of these discussions today was to start to find a balance between appreciation for the positives of Thanksgiving, along with an acknowledgment of the difficult experiences of indigenous people. To continue this learning process. I've included some information about the present-day Wampanoag people (the tribe whose members participated in the original Thanksgiving) as a handout. 
