Notes from Michelle

Every once in a while I will hear one of the students say to another student "that isn't very Montessori". This comment which I can only assume is meant to imply that the student on the receiving end of the message is not behaving in a way the first student feels is appropriate. However, hearing students say this phrase begs a larger question- what does it mean to either "be very Montessori" or "not very Montessori". I mean, Montessori was a person, she created a method of educating children but I doubt that the students are saying that the other child is not educating children correctly. My hope is that we have not somehow confused behavior with who Dr. Montessori was and the contributions she made. Yes, Montessori education includes conflict resolution. Yes, Dr. Montessori believed that each person has a cosmic task which is to take care of others and the earth. Yes, Dr. Montessori was a proponent of social justice. However, I don't think that any individual can be held accountable to "being Montessori". Montessori classrooms can be judged by how lessons are presented, or if there is a policy of freedom within limits in the classroom. The teachers in a Montessori classroom should adhere to these tenets, but when we interact with each other, there is no "Montessori Way" of doing that. There is respect, there is empathy, there is choosing to do the right thing. When we choose these, we are trying to honor what we believe correspond with the tenets of the methodology. Eagle Peak classrooms created a list of virtues which we talk to the children about- but even those were not written by Dr. Montessori. My hope is that in honoring the contributions Dr. Montessori has made, we do not assign behaviors to this methodology, but rather honor what she has done

simply by trying to make positive contributions to society ourselves.

In a similar vein, we have noticed an increase of exclusionary behaviors with students. We are hearing more of "you can't play" or "you aren't our friend", in the classrooms and at recess. While we definitely work on empathy and respect with the students, we need you to be partners with us in this. I know that right now it seems like our society as a whole is stressed out. There are things that we as adults see in the news or media on almost a weekly basis that are stressful and sometimes that stress filters down to our children without us even being conscious of this. Perhaps the most important thing we can do is to be aware and to be mindful of what our children are exposed to whether on the radio, television or simply just overhearing our conversations. The only hope society ever has is through its children. Let's all work together to help them practice more kindness.

Next Wednesday, the 15th is our annual Thanksgiving Feast. Our students will meet in the Eagle Peak Family Groups. These are groups made up of a teacher and students from each grade level. We appreciate the effort that so many parents led by Brandan Ricks have put forth for this event. 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
