Notes from Michelle

Yesterday I spoke with the 7th and 8th grade students (Adolescent Program) about cell phones and device usage while we are in New York. One of the things that struck me most from the conversation was that it is almost impossible to keep up with every possible way that children access media in their lives, and how many of the seemingly child friendly apps truly are not always so child friendly. A year ago we had two parents, one a SF police officer and one a tech specialist, who came to speak to the parents about safety for students online. I know that it can seem like reading your child's diary if you check their apps and phones... but with all the possibilities out there that we as adults just simply cannot keep current with (unless that is our line of work), it is crucial to know what your child is both seeing and posting to sights. Many of the games that they play online allow the possibility to connect with total strangers. There is no way of knowing if a person saying they are a 10 year old living in Ohio, really is a 10 year old living in Ohio. I know that we want to trust our children, and honestly, it isn't about not trusting them, but more about how to keep them safe in a world we are still learning to navigate ourselves

We have noticed lately several students whose parents arrange for UBER to pick them up or drop them off. It is actually against UBER rules for children under the age of 18 to ride in their cars without an

adult present. Please do not put Eagle Peak in the position of either not complying with UBER's rules or having to say "no" when asked to allow a child to be dismissed to an UBER driver. Thank you for your cooperation.

From the UBER TERMS and AGREEMENT:

Access and Use of the Services

User Accounts.

In order to use most aspects of the Services, you must register for and maintain an active personal user Services account ("Account"). You must be at least 18 years of age, or the age of legal majority in your jurisdiction (if different than 18), to obtain an Account. Account registration requires you to submit to Uber certain personal information, such as your name, address, mobile phone number and age, as well as at least one valid payment method supported by Uber. You agree to maintain accurate, complete, and up-todate information in your Account. Your failure to maintain accurate, complete, and up-to-date Account information, including having an invalid or expired payment method on file, may result in your inability to access or use the Services. You are responsible for all activity that occurs under your Account, and you agree to maintain the security and secrecy of your Account username and password at all times. Unless otherwise permitted by Uber in writing, you may only possess one Account.

UBER TERMS and AGREEMENT: (con't)

User Requirements and Conduct.

The Service is not available for use by persons under the age of 18. You may not authorize third parties to use your Account, and you may not allow persons under the age of 18 to receive transportation or logistics services from Third Party Providers unless they are accompanied by you. You may not assign or otherwise transfer your Account to any other person or entity. You agree to comply with all applicable laws when accessing or using the Services, and you may only access or use the Services for lawful purposes (e.g., no transport of unlawful or hazardous materials). You may not in your access or use of the Services cause nuisance, annoyance, inconvenience, or property damage, whether to the Third Party Provider or any other party. In certain instances you may be asked to provide proof of identity to access or use the Services, and you agree that you may be denied access to or use of the Services if you refuse to provide proof of identity.
