As report cards come out today, I want to remind everyone that if your child does not have all 3s and 4s- it is ok. We are only half way through the year and they are not yet expected to have mastered the skills that they are covering. While your child may have some 4s, most likely the majority of concepts will be marked with 2s and 3s. If a concept has an x next to it, then that concept has not been introduced yet. Please make sure to spend more time reading the narratives that tell about your child in order to understand how they are doing in the classroom.

We understand that sometimes you need your child to leave school without you. This is why we ask that you send a note giving your permission for your child to go with someone else or to walk home, etc.. However, if your child is leaving after school, they may not return to childcare that day. For example, if your child is walking to the library for a project with friends after school, that is

fine. They simply cannot return to childcare that day. Once they have left campus for the afternoon, they should not return. Please make arrangements for them to be picked up from their destination after school. Feel free to email me (michelle@eaglepeak.org) with any questions.

STUDENT USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES (NOT SCHOOL PROPERTY)

Cell phones, tablet computers (unless specifically called for with classroom permission), electronic games, music players or other such devices should not be brought to school by the elementary students. If an elementary student must bring a cell phone or other device for after school activities, it MUST be signed in to the front office and will be kept in a safe for the day. They can sign it out at the end of the day.

Adolescent students may bring cell phones if they take full risk of the item being lost or damaged. The cell phones for adolescents must not be in the back pack but will be placed in a cell phone locker in the classroom.

If a school staff member finds it necessary to confiscate a device, parent/guardian will be notified promptly and the device will be returned in accordance with school rules after the administrator or designee has consulted with the student's parent/guardian. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen electronic signaling devices. Students are to make arrangements with their parents/guardians to contact the school office when attempting to reach them during the school day.
