Notes from Michelle

Recently, it was suggested that the founders of Eagle Peak Montessori School were simply seeking an alternative to MDUSD schools for their children by opening a charter. I want to clarify for the record that this was not their main objective. These parents specifically wanted a Montessori education for their children, and they knew that opening a charter school would allow them this option. Personally, I feel that the ideal school district would be where each school had a different educational system, and both teachers and parents sought out the one that they felt was the one they were passionate about and best suited their child. But, Eagle Peak Montessori was not created as a statement in opposition to the district, as much as it was simply wanting something outside the traditional educational route.

I say this because as I watch neighborhoods and parent groups in various parts of this county (Florida, Alabama, Walnut Creek) attempt to redraw lines or to create funding for specific schools within a district I want to make sure that everyone understands that this was not the intent behind Eagle Peak Montessori's design. We absolutely fundraise for our specific school but we want our school to serve a diverse population who are be seen as a free "private" school. education for their child. We are not and should not ourselves that way and we do not want that to be the reason people seek us out. We hope that our message, that we are a Montessori school first and foremost, comes across loud and clear. We know Montessori works for most children, but we are equally aware that it is not right for every family.

Montessori education is not simply an academic program. Montessori education is about helping children become independent, develop a desire to learn, and to love the process of learning. Montessori education is about serving your community and making this world a better place for everyone, which includes understanding social justice concerns, and discussing at an age appropriate level how our choices affect the entire global community. Montessori education strives to help children understand the interconnectedness of all ethnicities of people and all countries, and even closer, of ALL communities. We cannot fund one small group of schools differently when they exist within a larger community of schools, without it negatively affecting children. Groups who feel that because they have more, they should receive more somehow lack the understanding that even if they provide their children with more music, more art, more sports, their children will still need to live with, work with, and be neighbors with, the children who were not given these opportunities. The larger picture is that we are all connected, and separating ourselves does not simply impact us- it impacts those we have chosen to separate from, often in far greater ways. Eventually, the impacts on those we have pulled away from WILL impact us, because we are all connected.

<u>Board Update</u>

Thanks to all our parents and friends that emailed the Walnut Creek City Council and/or attended the City Council meeting on the 18th. This issue is now moving into the County review process and two public meetings will be held next week as follows:

- May 2nd, 6PM Concord Senior Center (Wisteria Room) 2727 Parkside Circle, Concord
- May 3rd, 6PM The Gardens at Heather Farms (Camellia Room) 1540 Marchbanks Drive, Walnut Creek

This is an opportunity for County staff and Board Members to hear input from the public regarding the Northgate CAPS issue. As with the City of Walnut meeting we urge our community to attend one of these meetings to voice your views on the Northgate CAPS proposal to secede from MDUSD and create their own school district. Or, simply attend the meeting wearing your Eagle Peak shirt!

A few points to keep in mind: The Northgate CAPS group has published a snapshot of Ed Code that speaks towards how a charter school *may* retain their existing charter and site when a charter school is located within the boundaries of a proposed new district. This is only a snapshot of the applicable codes and may not be as easily executable as implied. Rest assured we are in close contact with our attorney and other charter school organizations who are studying this issue and will advise us accordingly.
