#### **Notes from Michelle**

If you listened to the news this week, Eagle Peak seems to be part of a trend. Apparently, there is quite the controversy in San Francisco Unified School District where an elementary school has discontinued homework, and that is reportedly part of a new trend being seen across the country. Hmm....wonder if the increased number of public Montessori schools across the country might have any influence on that "new trend".

We had such a great turnout for the Parent Education on Tuesday night, and a great discussion after. Thank you to all the parents who came out to learn more about the educational program you have chosen for your child. We plan to hold an extended Parent Education night in either late October or November, as a continuation of introduction to the curriculum.

Tuesday, at the Parent Ed night, Ellen spoke about three questions which the Montessori elementary and adolescent method are designed to help students answer beyond academics. Who am I? Where do I come from? What is my purpose? Those questions are really the essence of what makes the Montessori choice so different from traditional education. We are obviously concerned about making sure your child has access to and success with academics, because that will prepare them with a knowledge base for their future. However, we are much more concerned with whom the children work on becoming. A lot of people wonder about our Adolescent Program, and they are concerned about the size or what makes people chose to stay or leave. We are not as concerned, because we know that the

students who stay in that program will come even closer to finding out who they are, where they are from, and what their purpose is, without the added pressures of hundreds of other students being present for that transformation. They will work with teachers and fellow students who know them and can support them in whatever paths they take. The experiences that this program provides to students through the non-academic areas are without comparison. We truly believe that. Our students will not have multiple clubs to join, but they will go out in big cities and find out how to navigate and be independent. They will be able to face their challenges, and feel the power of successfully overcoming them. One of my favorite quotes by Dr. Montessori expresses exactly what I feel is the number one argument for why we created the adolescent program, "If education is always to be conceived along the same antiquated lines of a mere transmission of knowledge, there is little to be hoped from it in the bettering of man's future."

If you want to learn more about how our AP program provides opportunities and challenges to the students, please mark your calendar for October 20<sup>th</sup>! The AP teachers will introduce you to the subtle yet amazing things we have seen from the students in that program. I hope that you have all taken a couple of minutes to respond to the monthly survey question that went out this week. If you have not, please do. We are hoping to use this more immediate feedback to shape how we present some information.
