It is always so much fun to watch the students who have transitioned to Upper Elementary wave and look for their former Lower Elementary classmates and teachers. The new first years are always fun to get to know over the first few weeks.

I want to send out a HUGE thank you to staff who have been incredibly accommodating over the past few weeks, with the increased heat and other scheduling changes. We have an incredible staff at Eagle Peak Montessori, and I am grateful to get to work with them every day! We know that many families choose to allow their children to have access to phones, and other devices that allow them to communicate with their friends through texting or emails. Last week, I held a meeting with the Upper Elementary students to discuss the permanence and uncontrollable sharing of electronic communication. Perhaps they shared this with you. As a school, we obviously cannot control what happens outside of school hours, and we have no desire to do such. However, sometimes these communications can leak into school

hours. At that point it does become a school issue.

We would like to make a few suggestions to help with these matters. Please check in with what and how your child is communicating. You may feel it is a violation of privacy- but as we explained in the lesson- nothing electronic is truly ever private and they also need that lesson. Also, there are apparently many students who text or email at very late hours (some after midnight). Perhaps they should not have access to their devices in their rooms when it is time to sleep. Just think how tempting it is for us as adults to check out phones before bed and even sometimes if we wake up during the night. It is even more so for children, who are naturally more impulsive than we are. Below are a couple of articles on the topic. The third article from the Atlantic was sent to me by a parent, and it also is an interesting read.

<u>Notes from the Garden</u>

Big thanks to the parent who purchased misters and those who installed them - our outdoor classroom is a much happier place to be in the heat now!

All of our groups discussed Garden Guidelines and set intentions for our time together in the garden this year. We created beautiful garden bunting from

up cycled fabrics (another thank you from parents who donated old textiles). to the chimes. We prepared a bed and planted leeks, mizuna and spinach.

We begin our seed saving project next week. Seedsaving is a hands-on lesson in genetics as much as it is an agricultural skill and social justice tool. The United Nations' second Sustainable Development Goal is "End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture". Seed saving is an essential practice in achieving this goal. By the end of the month, all first through sixth years will have participated in some aspect of the seed-saving process.

Did you know that Eagle Peak has a school lunch waste management program called Waste Wizards that is student-run? Compostables, landfill and recyclables are separated out at lunch. Here are some tips to "Greening the Lunchbox":

- Pack a dishcloth or cloth napkin for your child to use as a placemat. Using placemats at school lunches is part of Grace and Courtesy at school, and cuts down on the volume of paper towels used.
- 2. Use a lunch box instead of a paper or plastic sack.
- Reusable containers and bags that go home to be washed and repacked cut down on landfill waste (plastic bags require special recycling that we don't have access to at school).
- 4. Pack drinks in washable bottles (Capri Suns require special recycling as well).
- Individually wrapped foods increase landfill waste (examples - pack a thermos with yogurt from a large recyclable container, pack a handful of pretzels or

> dried fruit from a large package or bulk bin into a washable snack bag).

6. We encourage students to bring home what they don't eat. This allows families to refine their lunches and decrease overall waste.

We are seeking a Waste Wizards parent volunteer for Fridays after lunch (about 1:30 pm, for approximately 30 minutes) to oversee recyclable sorting for the week and help clean our tools. Please contact me at garden@eaglepeak.org to fill this position and write "Waste Wizard Help" in the subject line.
