Notes from Michelle

As you know, the teachers in the Adolescent Program have been working so hard over the past three years to create this new addition to Eagle Peak. Unlike Montessori Early Childhood or Elementary classrooms, they were not given a manual or a set of lessons to give students in each subject. They have been creating those from working with the Common Core standards, training they received in Cincinnati, Montessori philosophy and their own talents and gifts. This can be both challenging and rewarding. Tuesday, they had their first site visit from their training program instructor. The instructor was so impressed with what these incredible teachers have created; she said she wished our school was closer so they could use us for a demonstration/observation site. That is huge considering we have only had this part of the program for one year and one month. (I know I said that the teachers have been working on it for three years, because they have ③.)

One of the things that the training instructor asked me was what I felt it was that contributed to the way the students interact with each other. She said that while they are definitely still normal kids, there is an underlying difference between them at some other schools. I told her I believe it comes from all of the teachers and staff holding our students to high expectations for behaviors. We know they won't always meet them but that doesn't change our expectation for them. When the little things matter, the bigger things, for the most part, take care of

themselves. We simply have a campus-wide agreed regarding standards. This is not always the case elsewhere and I believe that it definitely shows in our students. This is also why we have often heard from principals and teachers at the middle schools our former students attend, as to how they always know which students come from Eagle Peak!

The end of October is parent observation week. Please make time to come and observe your child in his/her classroom. This is a crucial part of the parent/teacher partnership. While those of you who have been here for several years, several children or both, may feel this process is the same year after year, it really isn't as there are changes every day in your child. Again, please make time to come to the school. PLEASE NOTE ADOLESCENT PROGRAM OBSERVATION IS THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 19th.

Independent Study Contracts are a great tool that the students, parents, and school have to help with absences during the school experiences each year. However, we need your help as parents to make sure a few of the following expectations are held to: a) The independent study pack must come back by the due date, completed. Students are expected to do this work outside of school. b) As the parent, please notify the school (Ms.Amy) as soon as you know your child will be missing more than two days of school, so that work can be prepared for your child. If the Independent Study packet is not completed by the due date, your child will not receive credit for attendance. It is critical that these forms are processed correctly, and in a timely manner. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation with this matter.

Music Notes from Ms. Allison

All Classes: This week and next Monday for Group A Lower El (First years and some 2nd years), we learned an three-part form circle dance that challenged the students to step in time to the music, change directions on beat 8, repeat a body percussion rhythm for section B, and then take 4 steps in and back out of the circle. All the while...singing a sequencing melody, keeping track of the order of the months, their birth month, and noticing who else was born in their birth month. there was an extra component of skipping (stephopping) in the middle of our circle. in time to the music, with lots of spatial awareness required when we were singing about their birth month.

Next, we did roll call with matching an assigned body percussion or series of pitches that matched the syllables in their name. Some students needed some group siren sounds to help them find their singing voices.

Finally, we learned a complicated body percussion (vou might call it Patty-cake - but this one was very challenging) that accompanied a traditional song. "Hey Lolly." The students worked with partners to master the assigned body percussion sequence and then were encouraged to create their own. Lower El students explored playing along with the recording with shakers. Several students were able to play the Bass and Contrabass Xylophone bars on the "Boom-boom" on A & D to introduce each phrase of music. Upper el received a lesson on the Major Scale and how sharps had to be added to F and C to make a D Major scale. They all also spent time with their partners creating new rhyming lyrics based on their own names to fit the phrase, "My partner's name is _Lilly_ ", "She has fun and acts real sillv !"

Upper El: We are getting very good at our "Rhythm of Math - 4-Down" exercise! We can now do it in under a minute and it is almost in sync (pretty amazing feat for 20 of us at a time!) Ask your student what this is and I know they will show you! Last year's recorders are making their way back into the classroom. Thank you. Still a few more to go.
