As I was speaking with a group of students the other day, we started a discussion of behavior choices and respect. We talked about how the easiest way to explain "being respectful", was, "be kind". 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### <u>Music Notes from Ms. Allison</u>

**Lower El Classes**: We focused on "opposite" types of movements and discovered that in many cases, there are several opposites for an action. We danced to a song called "Can You Do This?...Yes, I can!" in which opposites are demonstrated: high/low, fast/slow, jump/spin, clap/stomp. Then the students created their own opposites and shared them so we could try them as a group. Next, we worked with mallets and played lots of games and songs that encourage proper mallet technique for the best sound production from the Orff barred instruments (xylophones). Ask your child if they remember any of these mallet activities: "Click-Poing," "This is what I can do, everybody do it too," bulls and butterflies, kangaroos jumping, spiders crawling up and down the trees, and "Criss-cross, Applesauce."

**4th/5th Year Classes**: The recorders have been distributed and labeled. 4th years received soprano size and 5th years have added an alto size to their collection. Last week, I brought a consort of sizes (sopranino, soprano, alto, tenor, bass) so they could see and feel the finger spacing required for each. I played each instrument and they were enthralled with the tone quality of the larger intstruments - deeper and mellower. Yet, they loved the Irish sound of the high-pitched sopranino also. We are learning the recorder anthem, "Hot Cross Buns." I have asked the students to keep their instruments at school for the next 5 weeks so we can learn the basics before they begin practicing at home. Plus, we end up spending way too much classv time on missing instruments.

This week we started with a large movement activity based on the Dalcroze method. Students mirror each other as one leads movements that reflect the different pieces of music played for them. Beat, rhythm, meter, pitch level, dynamics, instruments, style, affect and speed of movement and repetition all influenced their creative choices. ### Music Notes from Ms. Allison

6th Years: We have started our unit on playing the ukulele. I have split the classes into two groups with amazing results. I can now give 12 students individual attention during our 45 minutes together. I saw better focus, more curiosity, less frustration, and more courtesy in these classes...more success in learning! The students learned about the parts of the instrument, variety of strumming styles and patterns, frets, tuning, fingering for C, G7 and F chords. We accompanied (as best we individually could with some just plaving the C chord) as we sang a funny song based on the traditional tuning, "My Dog Has Fleas, Uh-huh." We will be working up to scales and plucking melodies and will try out playing with a pick as well. The more time they have with the instrument, the easier it gets. I cannot loan the EPMS instruments out, however, you can purchase an affordable ukulele easily. EPMS used Lamorinda Music in Lafayette - tell them I sent you if you go!
