- Create & maintain volunteer database.

- · Determine procurement goal.
- · Maintains master donor database.
- Reviews donor list and identifies potential new donors:
- Designates committee members to various solicitation areas:
 - Establish demographic area (travel, restaurant, art, wine, jewelry)
 - Procurement methods: Online data entry, verbal requests: calls/in person
- · Tracks progress.

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Music Notes from Ms. Allison

<u>Lower EI</u>: I will meet with Group A on Mon Nov 2nd to make up for being absent on Nov 15th. As we did with Group B this week, we will be working with a Fall-themed chant:

Pumpkin patch. Pumpkin patch. Looking all around in my pumpkin patch. Here is a pumpkin, round and fat. Turn into a Jack-o-Lantern just like that.

We improvised body percussion rhythmic accompaniment as we chanted, discussed the different types of emotions we could carve on our "pumpkin faces" and tried them out, enacted the story of a pumpkin seed growing into a pumpkin and moving our bodies to reflect the sound effects I provided with my recorder. The challenge activity was to learn to clap 4 different 4-beat patterns written in basic rhythmic notation (made up quarter notes, eighth notes and a quarter rest) on a pumpkin cut-out. Each student picked one from my Trick-or-Treat pumpkin, memorized the pattern and then had to find the other students who had the same pattern just by clapping and listening. Next, the groups went to the Orff barred instruments and improvised accompaniment using their rhythmic pattern and chanted while playing.

<u>Upper EI</u>: 4th Years got to pass the 5 sizes of hand drums around the circle playing with their left hand and chanting: "left hand on the top"....because it was a fun way to remember to use your left hand on the top while playing recorder (in fact this trains them for all woodwinds and saxophones). They are working on melody and harmony parts for "Hot Cross Buns." Next class, we will see who can create a convincing street cry with their group using singing, movement and the recorder.

<u>5th years</u> have been working on naming notes on the staff by doing "Mad Minute" exercises. We measured their times and all of them were faster this week than last week. Yay! One class started a new percussion piece for

which I imagine we will compose a melody for alto rec order and xylophones. Both classes enjoyed the pumpkin patch rhythms challenge. And this week, we recited the Musician's Pledge one word at a time going around the circle. (The goal was to not sound like a robot, an extremely challenging activity requiring focus from each student.)

<u>6th years</u> reviewed C, G7 and F chords on the ukulele, including frets, fingering and strumming patterns. We listened to the quality of the felt picks and experimented with the different quality of sounds between bare fingers, finger nails, thumb strumming, and pointy end vs round vs side pick strumming. We learned the C7 chord and played a one-finger, one-chord song using a mash-up of "Put the Lime in the Coconut" and "Shortenin' Bread." Finally, we learned another one-finger, one-chord song using A minor for a Hungarian canon: "If I sing ahead of you, you will be behind me."
