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Music Notes from Ms. Allison

Reminder: Mark your calendars for the Parent Education Night on January 13th, 2016 at 7pm when I will present details about the music education program. Parents only.

UPPER EL: We have 60% participation in turning in the parent-and-student-signed "Recorder Responsibility Pledge" that was placed in your child's Friday Folder. They were due this week. More copies are available in the office. This is the first step in showing me that you all will respect the instrument, use the backpack rule and return the folders and recorders to class every Wed. Recorders will not be allowed to go home for practice until the signed pledge is turned in. Thank you for your attention to this important detail.

On Wednesday this week, the 4th and 5ths discussed "respect," who and what should have our respect, and performed a folk dance that allowed us to practice a respectful bow to seven things from our list: instruments, materials, environment, teachers, each other, ourselves, "The World." 4th years practiced "Cuckoo in the Clock" using pitches C & A, a rhythmic knocking pattern and students took turns with a partner playing a cuckoo birdcall at the right time from outside the classroom door. 5th years learned "En ten tina" on both soprano and alto recorders complete with accompaniment.

6th years, last week and this Thurs., created their own section of folk dance with their partners for the sea shanty, John Kanaka. The C scale on the ukulele and how to decipher the C-scale tablature methods was our focus during the work period.

LOWER EL: Pitch is the focus for December. We reviewed the 7 letters of the musical alphabet: a,b, c, d, e, f, g, learned the Kodály hand symbols for the

solfege system (do, re, mi, fa, so, la ti, do) and played a singing game using So and mi pitches while matching "Lock and Key" posters. What fits a monlock or a don-lock? Why, a mon-key and a don-key, of course. How about a tur-lock? ... Which transitioned us nicely to a Turkish children's game about walking through a forest and holding very still on one foot.
