
Notes from Michelle

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Music Notes from Ms. Allison

Since our last update, all grades 1st-6th participated in learning a rhythmic body percussion piece by Gunild Keetman (Carl Orff's colleague) called "Eine Kleine Kanon" or "A little round." We explored this piece extensively by learning it by rote, playing it with mallets, substituting the knee pat with striking a balloon lodged in between our knees with mallets (sounds like a drum), learning patterns and the form of the piece, definitions of "fine" and "da capo al fine," notating the rhythms on a special 4-line staff, arranging for un-pitched percussion, Orff instruments, recorders and/or drums, and of course, performing it in a round! I also encouraged the 4ths and 5ths to write their own rhythmic piece in class keeping two beats per measure.

They all enjoyed the warm-up games we played using the mallets to keep the balloon in the air and in control, only being allowed to take one step away from their chosen safe spot. This exercise helps to develop and practice following rules, integrity, accuracy, hand-eye coordination, problem-solving and team cooperation. Plus, it is just plain fun and visually entertaining!

This week, 4ths and 5ths mimed a "bucket brigade" while singing another round, "Scotland's Burning." We learned to play the notes on soprano recorders and still keep the bucket brigade going. We worked very hard on being able to sing and or play it in a round in 4-parts. Next, we discussed frame or hand drums and learned some basic techniques for holding and playing two different quality of sounds on each drum (a deep thumb strike and a finger tap on the rim). We added five different complimentary rhythmic chants to guide each color drum, for example the large red drum's was "Red Drum, red drum, play on the red drum." Of course, we explored them freely for sound

exploration and spun them around on the floor to hear the resulting oscillation as the they wobble to a resting position - which sounds completely different on the rug vs the tile.6th years are starting their unit on recorder ensemble music. They need their recorders at school on Thursdays. Just a few missing still. Group A started learning melody and soprano 2 harmony for Beethoven's "Ode to Joy." Group B will do same next week. I am looking forward to adding alto, tenor and bass recorder parts!

Lower El music classes will resume next Monday - hope you enjoyed your last two Mondays off.
