The teacher's task is to prepare the classroom environment for the children so they can learn without obstacles by making sure the classroom is designed in a way that promotes selfdirection and inspires inquiry. Similarly, my task as the principal is to prepare the school environment so that the teachers can teach without obstacle, by making sure they have materials, and training, and

daily support they need. Beyond that the board is there to prepare the vision by making sure that the Montessori educators are given the moral support needed and the financial stewardship to allow us to continue to do what we do. It all truly weaves together at Eagle Peak ,and I can tell you from my work in both the charter school world and the Montessori world, that is rare.

Next week the Adolescent Program students will embark on their Erdkinder experience at Hidden Villa. These trips that our older students take are so much deeper than simply field trips. They are hands-on learning in the most literal sense. They will be working on a farm, preparing their own meals, and learning about the process and politics of food. I feel like a beaming parent when I watch them go off into these weeks and come back with an even greater sense of self and of community, both within the class and globally.
