Music Notes from Ms. Allison

We've had a couple weeks of break due to Spring Recess and Conferences; we are back in full swing this week:

Do you know how many miles are between Wibbleton and Wobbleton? EPMS students do. Of course, it depends on if you take the road or as the crow flies.

Did you know that this Mother Goose Rhyme is based on two very true adjacent towns called Teddington and Toddington? Lower El students explored this nursery rhyme extensively by applying opposites to the two town names focusing on the following musical elements: dynamic (soft & loud), pitch (high & low), tempo (fast & slow), and timbre (nasal vs hooty - with many other options!) We also used two different length strings two represent the road and the path of the crow. We slowly pulled the string through our fingers as we recited the rhyme and discovered the phrase length pattern together (long-long-short-shortlong) which applied to both verses of the rhyme. Ah, symmetry! Next we used the string to represent pitch: the crow path was laid straight and we sang a single note that never changed pitch (a drone!), and the road string was creatively laid to go up and down and around the path of the crow but start and stop at the same places. We sang them, or I played them on recorder for them.

Upper EI: We have done some work on music theory, specifically naming and identifying intervals with written music as well as aurally. They were exposed to the concept of Harmonic (simultaneous sounding) and Melodic (successive) Intervals and how they look differently in written music. This week we learned a new round song that we plan on using to open the

Talent Show. Choreography is being created by the students over the next few weeks. Hold the date...Friday, May 13th for the Talent Show! They also have a recorder piece to play to end the show.

6th Years: Calling all bakers...no, we don't need you to bake. But we would like you to search for some bundt pans in your collection of kitchen items. They make a great gong. And we can even return them to be used for their original purpose undamaged! We need these ASAP for the 6th grade piece we are working up for the EPMS Talent Show! I only have 3 more classes with them until the show!



We are looking forward to another informative and inspiring Earth Week here at Eagle Peak! Miss Ellen and I are excited to be working with this year's Green Team which has representation from all three UE classrooms.
