The article originally ran in The Atlantic, and discusses the many skills that students develop when they lead the conference and reflect on their work with their parents. Of course this article focuses on a school in New Hampshire which is developing "new" methods of student centered learning in order to turn around a poor performing school. It constantly amazes, and yes, perhaps frustrates me, when traditional educators think they have discovered something new and unique, rather than learning more about Montessori and seeing that we have been practicing "student-centered" learning for over 100 years and guess what IT WORKS. ③

Some days are those peaceful days on campus when I can look out of my window and see up to 20 students working in the courtyard without an adult in sight and all of them are on task and doing their work. Today (Thursday) was one of those days. It just reaffirms that children are capable of more when we expect more. I have been speaking to the Upper Elementary students about this idea of "when you know better, you do better". see someone being unkind or disrespectful, they should say something. If their friends are laughing about something that might be hurtful to another student, they need to say something. Part of the cosmic task that Dr. Montessori believed we as humans have, is for us to take care of each other, taking a stand against disrespect or unkind behavior is a core part of taking care of each other.

Last week I received a letter from one of our parents about the differences she sees when she works on other campuses in the area as compared to ours. She commented that our students engage with the adults on campus and say hello and hold doors for others. These moments and reflections are such a welcome reminder on those days when we stop seeing the beautiful Montessori forest for the rare but sometimes distracting foliage. (Did I stretch the metaphor too far?)

- Board members are appointed by a formal application process.

CFEP Board

- Exists so we have maximum flexibility with funds we raise.
- Ensures major fundraisers are executed.
- CFEP and PTLG work together in recruiting volunteers for the various fundraisers.
- Usually only one meeting a month.
- Just show up to a meeting!

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


