Some of you may have heard that the CAASPP results were released Wednesday. Individual student reports are supposed be delivered in the next few weeks. Currently there is some work being done to help school officials understand that data. We have been told there is no way to compare this test to the STAR test and that we should not make those comparisons. When we know more I will share more.

During our back to school week of teacher professional development training, we were fortunate to bring back Lori Onderwyzer to train the staff in using positive discipline. If you are not familiar with the Positive Discipline I would highly encourage you to look into it. I am hoping that we will be able to schedule another parent education night with Lori as well. Look for information on that in the next few weeks.

Speaking of Parent Education, we will hold a Montessori philosophy night with Sibyl and Denise again in October. We will have more staff led parent education opportunities this year as well.

When we started the process of adding 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades, we added a new tradition of "family groups" and "Friday Gatherings". The aim of these new traditions was to increase the connection between the older students and the younger students. We will move our gatherings from Friday to Monday morning. I would like to encourage you to ensure that your child is on time to school every day, particularly Mondays. We will start our Gathering at 8:20 am. These Gatherings are quick opportunities to assemble together as a community seating the tone for the week to come. Students will return to class at 8:40 am, therefore if they are late, they may miss this opportunity. During these gatherings, the 5<sup>th</sup> grade students read quotes, which support the Eagle Peak virtues, and the 6<sup>th</sup> grade students facilitate the gathering thus encouraging the Upper El to take on a leadership role.



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# **Environmental Ed**



Not just 3 R's!

Our Waste Wizards work every day to make sure we Recycle everything we can at school! It's important to remind ourselves to consider the first two R's: Reduce and Reuse because its always better to make less waste to begin with (as in Refusing single use plastics). There's also Rot which diverts our food waste from the landfill to "cook" in the compost bin and eventually be returned to our garden as soil nature's amazing Recycle program! Here's some Food for Thought: The average child in American throws away 67 pounds of lunch waste a year at school. Here are some ideas that can help reduce lunch waste, which not only helps the environment but can also save you money (and the school too because it's expensive to haul all that garbage to the landfill every week, and much of our garbage is single use plastics):

- Pack lunches in reusable lunch boxes/bags instead of single use bags
- Include reusable silverware, cloth napkins, and placemats instead of single use
- Use reusable containers instead of zip-locks or plastic wrap, which do not recycle
- Use a refillable beverage container instead of disposable water bottles or juice boxes..

EPMS students are asked to pack their leftovers back in their lunchbox so you know what they eat and what they don't (and sometimes their leftovers are perfect for an after school snack).

It's always a win-win to go green and save some green!

Music classes at EPMS started this week:

#### LOWER EL:

I have classes with Lower EI students beginning next week on Monday afternoons: Room 301 at 12:30, room 302 at 1:30 and room 401 at 2:30. I only see half of each classroom which means I only see your student every other week at best due to Monday holidays. My lesson plans build on what we have learned in the previous lesson so, parents, please make an effort to have your child(ren) be in school on those afternoons. It makes a big difference in your child's confidence level. Plus, we have so much fun while we learn how to make music and dance together!

### <u>UPPER</u> EL:

We started a new curriculum this week called "The Rhythm of Math" by Keith Terry and Linda Akiyama which piloted in Lafayette public school in 2012. It was an easy transition since I had already been teaching them Keith Terry's body percussion basics for many years. Check out praise for it
